Wrestling Just a Part of NRPPD Employee's Life

For one Northwest Rural Public Power District employee, wrestling is just a part of life. If Brad Johnson wasn't competing on the mat, he was coaching some young grapplers, from almost toddler age to high school age in addition to cheering on his own.

Brad Johnson, current Planning & Staking Engineer at Northwest, was introduced to wrestling while he was in elemen-

tary school at Mirage Flats District 30. "My older brother Todd along with a bunch of the kids on the Flats wrestled, it was just what we did," Johnson explained. He started out in Federation and then moved up into Junior High and High School competition. He noted he only weighed 98 lbs. when he was a freshman and there were only four kids in the District in that bracket, so it made it easy to qualify for the State Tournament.

Even while he was in high school back in 1983, he began

to support our wrestlers in various meets, offering guidance in every match,"

Heesacker went on to add, "His legacy will continue to inspire generations of wrestlers to come, reminding us all that true success is not measured solely by wins and losses but the lives we touch and the lesson we impart."

Johnson was presented a plaque and a framed "Coach" signed by all the current wrestlers.

Johnson says he's always enjoyed the sport and it's a way for him to give back to the community. While he claims to never have been the "head coach", he recalls several of his "fellow coaches" which included Ferrel, Ron Haag, Curt Hunter, Jim McCarter, Tom Housh, Brett DeHaven, Jim Jackson, Pat Coffing, Jared Todd, Chuck Blome, Jeff Strotheide, Chris McDonald, Trent Dierksen, Joey Johnson, Jake Johnson, Clint Blonien, Brad Beguin, Heath Peters, Mike Starke, Ava McKillip, Jake Lemmon and Brenton Abbott. Johnson is required to do a training course every year online and have a background check to qualify as a coach. He also served as a wrestling referee a few years.

His favorite part of coaching has been the kids and the people he has met along the way. One season, they had 42 wrestlers on the team. It wasn't until 2009, that Hay Springs was able to host their own meet at Lister-Sage Community Center.







Loaded Mac and Cheese

- 4 slices thick-cut bacon, cut into 1/4-inch thick pieces
- · 4 small yellow onions, cut into half moons
- · kosher salt, to taste
- 16 oz macaroni, or pasta of choice
- 6 tablespoons butter, divided, plus more for the pan
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 5 cupswhole milk, warmed
- 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 1 teaspoon hot sauce
- 1 pinch ground nutmeg
- · freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 2 1/2 cups freshly shredded sharp Cheddar cheese
- · 6 ounces Gruyere cheese, grated
- 1 bunch scallions, green tops only, thinly sliced
- 1 cup panko breadcrumbs
- · flaky salt, to finish

Place bacon in a large deep Dutch oven skillet and cook over medium-high heat, turning occasionally, until evenly browned, about 10 minutes. Remove bacon with a slotted spoon and set aside.

Add onions and a generous pinch of kosher salt to the rendered fat. Allow to cook over medium-low heat, stirring often, until onions are deeply caramelized, about 40 minutes. As onions cook, you may need to add water ¼ cup at a time, to keep the onions from burning. After 40 minutes, the onions should be deeply browned and jammy in consistency. Once the onions have reached the desired color and consistency, remove from heat and set aside.

Meanwhile, about 20 minutes after the start of cooking time for the onions, bring a large pot of generously salted water to a boil. Add pasta and cook for 5 minutes. Drain and return pasta to the pot.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish with butter.

Melt 4 tablespoons butter in a deep skillet over low heat. Add flour and cook until flour turns golden brown and smells nutty, about 2 minutes. Slowly add milk, a little at a time, while whisking constantly. Once all the milk has been incorporated, increase heat to medium and cook, stirring constantly, until sauce has thickened and can coat the back of a spoon, 10 to 12 minutes.

Remove sauce from heat and stir in mustard, hot sauce, nutmeg, a pinch of salt, Cheddar cheese, and gruyere

cheese. Whisk until cheese is fully melted.

Add cheese sauce, reserved bacon, caramelized onions, and scallions to pasta. Fold in with a rubber spatula until everything is well incorporated. Season with salt and pepper. Transfer pasta to the prepared baking dish.

Melt the remaining 2 tablespoons of butter in a small skillet over medium heat. Once melted, add Panko breadcrumbs and cook until toasted and golden brown, 3 to 4 minutes. Bake in the preheated oven until cheese has melted and top is lightly browned, about 30 minutes.

Turn on the broiler and broil on high until the top is bubbly and brown, 1 to 2 minutes.

Remove from the oven and let cool slightly. Finish with a pinch of flaky salt and black pepper and serve warm.

Stuffed Mushrooms

- 12 whole fresh mushrooms
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- · 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon onion powder
- ¼ teaspoon ground cayenne pepper

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Spray a baking sheet with cooking spray. Clean mushrooms with a damp paper towel; carefully break off stems. Chop stems extremely fine, discarding the tough end of stems.

Heat oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add garlic and chopped mushroom stems; fry until any moisture has evaporated, taking care not to burn garlic. Set aside to cool.

Stir in cream cheese, Parmesan cheese, black pepper, onion powder, and cayenne. The mixture will be very thick; use a teaspoon to fill each mushroom cap with a generous amount of stuffing. Arrange mushroom caps on the prepared cookie sheet.

Bake in the preheated oven until the mushrooms are piping hot, about 20 minutes.
