Hay Springs Couple Find Perfect Fit with Lumber Yard

Caleb and Sammy Milne of rural Hay Springs weren't quite sure what they wanted to do, but they were ready for a change. "We were ready to do something around home, and our family was right for this opportunity" said the young father of two boys and now a daughter. Caleb, a 2013 Hemingford High School graduate, had been away from home a lot on his previous job as a signalman for Burlington Northern Sante Fe.

It became official on July 23, 2021, Caleb and Samantha Milne together with his parents, Jim and Tami Milne became the new owners of Hay Springs Lumber & Hardware. The previous owners, Dave and Mary Hansen, had owned and operated the family business for over 50 years.

Caleb was a good fit for the hardware store, with experience in a variety of trades. After graduating from Northeast Community College at Norfolk in 2015 where he earned an Associates in Science Agronomy, he went on to UNL and earned his Bachelor's degree in Agronomy in 2017. While he was in school, he worked part time at Menard's where he received some post frame experience.

While he was in high school and attending school in Norfolk, he was employed by Sorensen Irrigation where he gained electrical knowledge. When he returned from

Lincoln, he went back to work for Sorensen for a couple of years before going to work for BNSF in 2019 and was away in Wyoming quite often.

He and his wife, Sammy, live nine miles south of Hay Springs. She continued to work for Mobius in Hemingford until March 2022 in addition to doing the bookwork for their new business. She resigned her job to focus completely on the lumber yard and their expanding family. Their youngest, daughter Emelia was born that following August. "We hired my brother, Kendall, that May to help over the summer while I was on maternity leave with Emelia," explained Sammy. "He resigned this September and moved to Montana," she added.

Immediately after they purchased the business, they started making some basic renovations starting with the office space. They installed new flooring and painted, a phone system with updated internet service, and added a water heater which they never had before!

They have updated the north corner which contains rolled vinyl samples, carpet samples, and click-together plank flooring and trim options, as well as back-splash tile samples. "The opposite corner will display our main siding offerings, shingles, and product literature for those as well as garage (Continued on Page 2)

doors, windows, interior and exterior doors, and specialty products from our various suppliers," said Sammy.

Last winter, the Milnes rebuilt the paint aisle to make it more easily accessible and installed a new Benjamin Moore paint chip display. In addition to Benjamin Moore Paints, some of their other popular brands in stock include: Diamond Kote, LP Smartside and Hardieboard siding; Crescent hand tools; Diablo blades; Freud router bits; Gerkin windows; Simonton windows; Triversa and Congoleum flooring; in addition to Malarky shingles to name a few. Some of their newer items include a fishing section.

"Our most requested products are paint and general building supplies. We have so many different products that it is hard to narrow it down more than that! Benjamin Moore is an exceptional paint, and people like we can store their



color choice for projects for future use/touch-ups," explained Sammy. "We do sell a lot to contractors. They like that we have a lot of options for suppliers and can get in most anything that they need," she added.

Caleb is almost exclusively in charge of ordering any special orders and all of the lumber, windows, doors, etc. Both he and Sammy run the register, mix paint, ship out UPS packages and get things out of the lumberyard for people. Sammy takes care of the accounting, marketing and advertising. Tami comes in occasionally to help run the register and



help with our main deliveries in the middle of the week. Jim usually does not work in the store; he does help with our projects when needed- like the display corners.

In addition to their products, Caleb has began smaller in home handyman repairs. "We hear all the time how people need help with small jobs and cannot get anyone to help them. A lot of contractors just don't have the time to take on these small jobs alongside their large projects," noted Sammy. The Milnes decided since Caleb was definitely capable of doing a lot of these things, it would be helpful for the community. "He has replaced some skylights, replaced a faucet, reinstalled base trim, installed several doors, screen doors, and windows, and he is currently working on several garage door repairs," said Sammy. They also offer free deliver on orders of 5 gallons or more of paint and other items within a 40 mile radius.

The Milnes are enjoying their new business adventure. Sammy loves the ability to choose what we carry to best serve the people in addition to interacting with their customers as well. "I also enjoy the accounting side of my duties and find analyzing our sales to plan out future purchases or sales patterns very interesting," said Sammy.

Caleb likes being the problem solver. "I like being able to solve problems that people have without asking permission or worrying whether I should or not. I can do it, so I just get it done. I also like the flexibility we have so I can be with our family more than I did at previous jobs," noted Caleb.

Common Electrical Hazards to be Aware Of

• Overburdened circuits from extra appliance usage: During winter, people tend to use more electrical appliances like space heaters, holiday lights, and electric blankets. This increased demand can overload circuits, leading to fires or tripped circuit breakers.

• Use of portable heaters and electric blankets: Portable heaters and electric blankets, if used improperly, can cause overheating, sparks, or even fires. They should be used according to manufacturer guidelines to minimize these risks.

• Snow and ice can damage outdoor electrical systems: Snow and ice accumulation on outdoor electrical components like power lines, meters, or outlets can cause damage, leading to electrical hazards or power outages.

• Water exposure to outdoor electrical components is risky: Snowmelt or rainwater can come into contact with outdoor out-

lets or wiring, increasing the risk of electrical shock or short circuits.

• **Frozen pipes may cause issues:** Frozen pipes can burst and cause water damage, potentially reaching electrical systems, creating hazards, or causing appliances to malfunction.

• Wet or damp conditions increase shock hazards: Wet or damp areas in and around the house can increase the risk of electrical shock, especially when using electrical equipment in these conditions.


• Inadequate insulation can lead to heat loss and wiring problems: Poor insulation in walls or attics can result in heat loss, causing electrical systems to work harder. Additionally, cold temperatures can affect wiring insulation, potentially leading to electrical faults.

• Tree branches near power lines can cause outages:

Overhanging tree branches can come into contact with power lines during winter storms, causing power outages and posing a risk of electrocution.

Crab-Stuffed Mushrooms

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons minced green onion
- 1 cup cooked crabmeat, finely chopped
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup dry bread crumbs
- ¼ cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- ½ teaspoon dried dill weed
- 1/2 cup butter, melted
- 1 1/2 pounds fresh button mushrooms, stems removed
- ¹/₂ cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- ¼ cup dry white wine

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F.

Melt 2 tablespoons butter in a skillet; cook and stir green onion until softened, about 2 minutes. Transfer green onion to a bowl. Stir in crabmeat, bread crumbs, 1/4 cup Monterey Jack cheese, egg, lemon juice, and dill weed until well mixed.

Pour 1/2 cup melted butter in a 9x13-inch baking dish; turn mushroom caps in butter to coat. Fill mushroom caps with the crab mixture and sprinkle with remaining 1/2 cup Monterey Jack cheese. Pour white wine into baking dish.

Bake in preheated oven until cheese is melted and lightly brown, 15 to 20 minutes.

Slow Cooker Taco Soup

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 (16 ounce) can chili beans, with liquid
- 1 (15 ounce) can kidney beans with liquid



- 1 (15 ounce) can whole kernel corn, with liquid
- 1 (8 ounce) can tomato sauce
- 2 cups water
- · 2 (14.5 ounce) cans peeled and diced tomatoes
- 1 (4 ounce) can diced green chile peppers
- 1 (1.25 ounce) package taco seasoning mix

Place the ground beef, onion, chili beans, kidney beans, corn, tomato sauce, water, diced tomatoes, green chile peppers and taco seasoning mix in a slow cooker.

All ingredients placed in slow cooker.

Mix to blend, and cook on Low setting for 8 hours.

Kielbasa with Peppers and Potatoes

- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1 (16 ounce) package smoked kielbasa sausage, diced
- · 6 medium red potatoes, diced
- 1 red bell pepper, sliced
- 1 yellow bell pepper, sliced

Heat oil in a pan over medium heat. Place kielbasa and potatoes in the pan. Cover and cook, stirring occasionally, until potatoes are tender, about 25 minutes.

Mix bell peppers into the pan, and continue cooking until peppers are just tender, 5 minutes.


Buttered Noodles


